EI/ECSE Alphabet Soup: How It Can Nourish Your Program

Every field has its own jargon. Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education is no exception. In this interactive session, we will examine Individual Family Service Plans: what they look like, how to read them and how to utilize the information to benefit the children in your care.

Including Samuel- Reflections on inclusion in our lives and work

We will explore and apply inclusive philosophies during this 2 ½ hour session. It is centered around viewing Dan Habib's award winning documentary about the hopes and struggles of his family to fully include his son Samuel in their community. Group facilitated conversation and personal reflective activities follow the film.

Join us in exploring commonly used support strategies such as developmentally appropriate practices, universal design, positive behavior supports, embedded instruction and interventions, picture exchange systems, visual supports and social stories. As you begin to apply these tricks of the trade, all your kids will benefit!

Special Needs Don't Stop When the Bell Rings!

Just because school time is over for the day doesn't mean a child or youth's needs end for the day! Come learn how to read IEP's, take that information and use it to adapt activities that will help you continue to support the child's development while in your care.
